With some of BC's finest theatres (Bell Theatre,

Wheelhouse Theatre, Chandos Pattison, Surrey Capital Playhouse to name a few), theatre aficionados in Surrey have an established and vibrant theatre scene to experience. The fact that Surrey Civic Theatres celebrate 50 years in 2018 on 3 stages, speaks to the theatre in our City.

However, few know what takes place behind the curtain. Ellie King of Royal City Theatre (rctheatre herself as a proficient Producer/Director. Crediting the ACS for helping get her start in Surrey, Ellie produces her popular Fall panto and Stage Series (auditions in April & June). If you are

interested in behind-thescenes opportunities like Producing, Set & Lighting Design, Costume Design or Directing - you can learn it and do it - amateur or professionally - in Surrey.

in the Classics, then take in a performance or two from the 36 year old FVGSS: A Musical Theatre Society [fvgss.org] who specialize in panto's, Gilbert & Sullivan operettas and Broadway, or laugh and sing along with the comedic stylings of The Vaudevillians [thevaude villians.com]. If your tastes lean toward Contemporary productions, check out the latest stage trend 'readers theatre' with Naked Stage Productions [nakedstage .net] or the eclectic offerings of the Langley Players [langleyplayers .com]. Whatever your taste

is in theatre, there is a stage in Surrey that will satisfy you completely and the ACS [artscouncilofsurrey.ca] will help you find it.

MUSIC

If your theatre interests lay Surrey's Music scene is explosive! Whether you enjoy the high energy performances at Fusion Fest, the tranquil Music in the Park series [surrey.ca] or you sayour Orchestral/Chamber music then Surrey is your place to be. For an Orchestral and Chamber Music experience check out Surrey Symphony Arts experience, or come Society (surreysymphony .com] for excellent performances by the Surrey Youth Orchestra and Chamber groups. Wish to learn how to play an instrument instead of listening to others play?

Learn to play anything from a fiddle with Hazelmere Heritage Fiddlers [valleybluegrass .net] to a south Asian instrument at South Asian Arts [southasianarts.ca]. Sometimes the instrument you want to learn is your voice. If Choral or Barbershop are more your style, then take in several performances (or audition) this Fall/Winter by popular vocal groups as: The Handel Society of Music [handelsociety.ca]. the Peace Arch Chorus [peacearchsings.com] and the Westcoast Harmony Chorus (westcoastsings .com]. If you write your own songs and sing them, contact Blue Frog Studios [bluefrogstudios.ca] and lay down a few tracks. You never know - you may be discovered!
