Try Something New Challenge

Our first event in March, was an online visual arts event, called the Try Something New Challenge. Partnering with Opus Art Supplies, we created an online opportunity for youth to share their visual art talents. Each week, two prompts were posted on Monday and the participants would create an artwork for both prompts by Friday of the same week. ACS staff created sample artwork there were posted with the prompts each week. We had 9 participants and throughout the 5 weeks in March, and all those that posted, were eligible for the draw to win one of two prize baskets worth \$100. 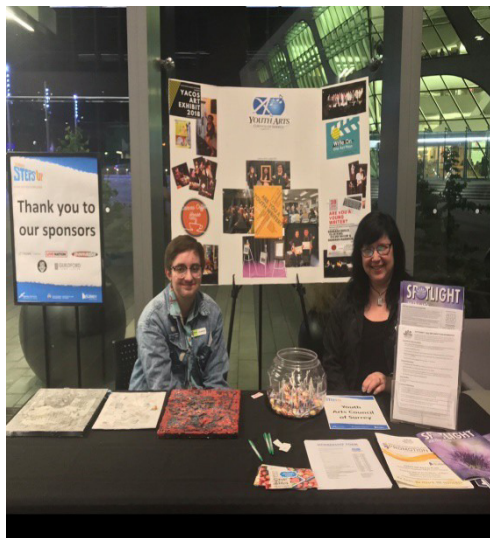

Street Art

Arts Council of Surrey board director, Ken Bradshaw, asked YACOS co-ordinator, Lyn, if youth could be invited to create large art pieces for display in outdoor, public locations. The purpose was to give youth artwork some exposure and for the public to enjoy local youth artists' work. Funding came from a Local Love Fund micro-grant from United Way Lower Mainland; Arts Council of Surrey alternate board director, Anna Hall, is also a United Way Community Builder in Newton/Whalley, and collaborated with Ken and Lyn on this project.

The theme for the artwork was Surrey's Geographic and Natural Features, and the artwork was fabulous! The final decision was that the artwork was displayed in four COVID vaccination centres in Surrey, so that people waiting in line had nice artwork to view.



Surrey Steps Up

Our third event on March 6, was Surrey Steps Up, an annual showcase of the positive impact youth has on the city. YACOS set up a table in the atrium of City Hall, with our display board, Spotlight magazines, YACOS membership forms and some visual art pieces by member, Desmond Tompkins. We had quite a few opportunities to engage with the public to let them know about YACOS and the ACS. There was a great turnout and we are planning on making this an annual event for YACOS. We also had a free draw for a Tim Hortons gift card.
